+		A lot of	●	●	<p>These quantifiers are used to talk about a <b>large quantity of something</b>.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There are <b>many</b> sandwiches on the table. (countable)</li> <li>• There is <b>much</b> rice in the bowl. (uncountable)</li> </ul> <p>A lot can be used with countable and uncountable, just be careful with singular and plural in the verb:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There are <b>a lot of</b> sandwiches on the table. (countable)</li> <li>• There is <b>a lot of</b> rice in the bowl. (uncountable)</li> </ul>

		Some	●	●	<p>This quantifier indicates a <b>neutral quantity</b> (not big, not small) and it can be used with countable and uncountable nouns, in affirmative sentences:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is <b>some</b> apples / There is <b>some</b> butter on the table</li> </ul>
		A few	●		<p>These quantifiers refer to <b>small quantities</b>.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There are <b>a few</b> eggs in the fridge. (countable)</li> <li>• There is <b>a little</b> sugar in my coffee. (uncountable)</li> </ul>
		A little		●	
		A / An	●		<p>These mean 'one' and they are used with singular countable nouns:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is <b>a</b> cookie in the jar.</li> <li>• There is <b>an</b> orange on the table.</li> </ul> <p>Uncountable nouns are only singular, but you cannot use <b>a/an</b> with them, because they are not countable:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is <del>a</del> <b>water</b> in the fridge.</li> </ul>
		Any	●	●	<p>This quantifier is used in questions and in negative sentences. Be careful because there is a change in meaning:</p> <p>In questions: 'any' refers to indefinite or unknown quantity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Is there <b>any</b> bread?</li> <li>• Do you have <b>any</b> carrots.</li> </ul> <p>In negative: 'any' expresses absence or lack of something.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There isn't <b>any</b> bread. (There is no bread)</li> <li>• I don't have <b>any</b> carrots. (I have no carrots)</li> </ul>
